A CBS correspondent since 1998, Hartman is known for creating moving stories about ordinary people doing extraordinary things in his weekly feature "On The Road" and new series, "Kindness 101." Tens of thousands of teachers have used his videos for lessons on empathy, honesty, fortitude and courage.

Day two begins with Dr. Maurice Elias delivering the keynote "Cracking the Intrinsic Motivation Code: 5 Insights to Help Students Discover Their Moral Compass," followed by more informative breakout sessions and ending with a celebration of the 2023 National Schools of Character.

Assess Your School Using the 11 Principles Framework

Based on decades of research on effective schools, the 11 Principles serve as guideposts to plan, implement, assess and sustain a comprehensive character development initiative. For more than 25 years, schools have used this framework to transform their schools by creating cultures that support and challenge students and adults to strive for excellence, increasing achievement for all learners, developing prosocial behaviors, and improving job satisfaction and retention among teachers.

Each principle is defined in terms of two to four items that describe what the principle should look like when implemented. Key indicators of exemplary practice follow each of these items. The framework includes a scoring guide to help measure both the current status of implementation and progress over time.

The standards articulated in the *11 Principles Framework for Schools* are also used to evaluate and certify schools and districts as part of Character.org's School of Character program. Synergy & Leadership Exchange is the state sponsor and works in partnership with Character.org to provide the program in Minnesota.
